WHAT GOES IN THE BLUE BOX

RECYCLE PROPERLY

- Empty and scrape all contents from containers before recycling
- Do not crush or flatten cans, plastic bottles or milk and juice cartons
- Flatten cardboard and boxboard boxes like cereal, cracker and shipping boxes
- Put items loose in blue box, not in plastic bags or tucked into other items
- Put paper towels and tissues in the green bin, not the blue box
- Place your blue box at the curb by 7 a.m. and put heavier items on top

PAPER



Cardboard, boxboard and frozen food boxes (no liners)



Egg cartons



Juice boxes, soup and milk cartons (no straws)



Newspapers and magazines



Paper bags and rolls



Greeting cards (no decorations)



- No battery-powered items
- No black plastic
- No coffee cups

- No cutlery or straws
- No foam containers or packaging
- No plastic bags

PLASTIC



Clamshell containers (no black plastic)



Drink containers (no straws)



Food containers (empty)



Pop, water bottles and jugs (empty, lids on)



Shampoo, personal care, detergent, household cleaning containers (empty)

METAL



Aerosol cans (empty, remove lid)



Aluminum cans (empty)



Aluminum foil and trays (empty)



Food cans and tins (empty)

GLASS



Bottles, jars and lids (empty, lids removed)



Use a reusable water bottle or coffee cup to reduce your waste.



WHAT GOES IN THE GREEN BIN

- Green bin material is turned into biogas for electricity and heat, compost and fertilizer, reducing greenhouse gas emissions
- Remove organics from plastic packaging before placing in the kitchen catcher
- Line your kitchen catcher with certified compostable bags. Please contact your local municipality to see if there are other liner options
- Plastic packaging products labelled "compostable", "biodegradable" or "bioplastic" don't break down in composting facilities and cannot be recycled. Please place these items in the garbage

Food-soiled paper plates and cardboard



Microwave popcorn bags



Muffin wrappers



Paper straws, towels, napkins and tissues



Shredded paper (small amounts)



Disposable diapers, sanitary and incontinence products



Fur and hair



Houseplants



Pet waste (including cat litter)



Use a kitchen catcher in your bathroom to collect tissues and sanitary products, then place in the green bin.

W WHAT GOES IN THE GARBAGE





Black plastic

Broken toys

Coat hangers



Disposable cutlery and straws



Drink pouches



Hoses



Personal care items



Plastic bags, packaging and wrap



Some of the garbage collected from the curb goes to the Durham-York Energy Centre in Clarington, ON where the heat generated by the waste combustion is used to generate electricity and steam and recyclable materials are recovered from the ash.

Single-use masks and gloves



Snack wrappers and gum



Stir sticks and toothpicks



Take-out cups, straws, lids and coffee pods



Wipes, mop and dryer sheets

Place waste out by 7 a.m. the day of collection.



Your local city or town is responsible for picking up green bin, recycling, garbage and yard waste at the curb and delivering it to York Region to process.

Check your city or town's waste calendar for all curbside collection details.



CLOTHING AND TEXTILES

Yard waste is collected for free from the curb by your local city or town. Yard waste can also be dropped off for a fee at the following locations:

- Georgina Transfer Station
- McCleary Court Community Environmental Centre
- Richmond Hill Compost Facility (Miller Compost)

Acceptable yard waste includes:

- Christmas trees
- Flowers and garden plants
- Leaves, shrubs, branches and weeds
- Vegetable garden waste including pumpkins

Additional notes about the Richmond Hill Compost Facility:

- This facility accepts grass clippings and sod, with dirt removed, in small residential quantities
- Yard waste in plastic bags must be emptied on site; yard waste in kraft paper bags does not need to be emptied

Guidelines:

- Items such as animal waste, kitchen and food waste, rocks, sand, clay and soil are not accepted as yard waste
- Root balls must be no larger than two feet by two feet and brought to Georgina Transfer Station for a fee; please contact a private waste disposal company for larger root balls
- Tree stumps must be cut down into one-foot sections, have no rocks or soil attached and brought to McCleary Court CEC, Richmond Hill Compost Facility or Georgina Transfer Station to be disposed of for a fee; please contact a private waste disposal company for larger tree stumps

Unwanted clothing and textiles (without hangers) are accepted at all York Region waste depots, except the Markham HHW Depot, for donation and/or recycling. Check with your local city or town for additional drop-off locations.

Examples of clothing and textiles include:

- Backpacks
- Belts
- Blankets
- Clothes
- Hats
- Pillows
- Shoes
- Sheets
- Stuffed toys
- Towels

Electronic waste (e-waste) is electronic equipment that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste and any associated batteries should not be thrown in the garbage as there are many components that can be recycled. Some are considered hazardous and may start fires. Electronics in working condition are reusable and should be donated.

Examples of e-waste include:

- Cables and chargers
- Cameras
- Computer towers, laptops and modems
- Game systems
- Monitors, printers and scanners
- Radios, stereos and speakers
- Telephones, fax machines and cellphones
- Televisions, VCRs and DVD players

Guidelines and limits:

- Remove all packaging and batteries where possible
- Maximum 50 kilograms per household per day
- Disassembled electronics will not be accepted

SCRAP METAL/METAL APPLIANCES

These items are accepted at all waste depots except the Markham HHW Depot. Refrigerated appliances, such as air conditioners, freezers, refrigerators may have a fee for removal of chlorofluorocarbons (CFC).

Check with your local city or town for additional curbside collection options.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything in your home that is corrosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. For health and safety reasons, HHW should never be placed in the garbage or down the drain. It should be taken to a York Region waste depot for free disposal.

Examples of HHW include:

- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Compact fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- Paints
- Perfume, nail polish and remover
- Pesticides and fertilizers
- Pharmaceuticals
- Pressurized containers like propane tanks or aerosol cans containing product
- Sharps (needles and syringes)
- Used car and engine products like antifreeze, motor oil and filters











Guidelines and limits:

- Industrial, commercial or institutional hazardous waste materials are not accepted
- Containers (including jerry cans) will not be returned
- Materials should be in original packaging or well-labelled
- Do not mix substances
- Sharps must be in puncture-proof, non-glass containers with a tight-fitting lid labelled "Needles/Sharps"
- Residents can drop off 60 litres of household hazardous waste and 20 compact fluorescent tubes per household per day


