Encroachment onto the Boulevard

Some minor encroachments may be permitted within the road allowance so long as they do not obstruct the delivery of Town Services. Please contact the Public Works Department for information on encroachments.

Homeowners contemplating work on Municipal property must complete an encroachment permit.

The Town will not be held responsible for damage that occur to encroachments placed on the boulevard without approval. Your co-operation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Municipal staff will perform maintenance operations within the boulevard as deemed necessary.

Boulevard Facts

- The boulevard is the area between the edge of the pavement or curb of the roadway and the adjacent property line.
- The boulevard is municipal property; portions may be grassed, graveled or paved and a Town tree may have been planted in front of your home. Placement of trees on the boulevard, by the homeowner is not permitted.
- The boulevard may or may not have a sidewalk.
- The boulevard may contain above and/or under-ground

municipal services & utilities.

List of Items to AVOID on a Boulevard

Homeowners should AVOID placing the following items on the boulevard in front of their property because it can hinder Town maintenance activity and can create a liability for the municipality. The Town will not be held responsible for any damage that occurs to these items while engaged in routine maintenance/service delivery.

• **AVOID** paving the non-driveway portion of the boulevard with any raised material including gravel, asphalt, stonework, interlock pavers.



• **AVOID** placing any structures including retaining walls, decorative walls, pillars.



 AVOID constructing raised curb to sidewalk or street curb



 AVOID landscaping around Town trees and fire hydrants including rocks, bricks, flowers & bushes.



• **AVOID** landscaping to sidewalk or street curb including wood chips, soil, rocks, landscape lighting and underground watering systems.
