DECLARATION OF INTENT AND VOWS

faithful union between two persons, the result of which is the formation of a family unit	
whose members shall help, support and enjoy each other in good times and in bad times	
and that children should enjoy the security of family life, love and home. It is this	
relationship that these two persons wish to have declared and celebrated.

shall be the symbol/ of my love."		
Officiant to 2 nd person:		
This ring is a symbol of your marriage and a symbol of your lo	ve and of your life together.	
Please place this ring on the third finger of's left ha	and saying after me:	
"With this ring, / I thee wed. / I shall love, / honour and cherish thee/ and this ring/		
shall be the symbol/ of my love."
